We provide services to people across all age groups, from Health Visitor services for new born babies and their families through to services which support older people with complex health and social care needs.

Community Care

Providing in-patient, out-patient and community services on a locality basis to adults and older adults across Worcestershire.

With five community hospitals, four older adult mental health in-patient wards, Minor Injury Units, district nursing and podiatry, as well as numerous specialist services, this is the Trust's largest service delivery unit.

Adult Mental Health

Providing mainly community and in-patient services to adults with mental health needs across Worcestershire, with community mental health services being delivered through integrated health and social care teams.

Learning Disability Services

Providing adult and children's respite, out-patient and community contact activity for people with Learning Disabilities and their families, mainly for the population of Worcestershire.

Children, Young People and Families

Providing general child health and specialist mental health services to children, young people and their families across Worcestershire.

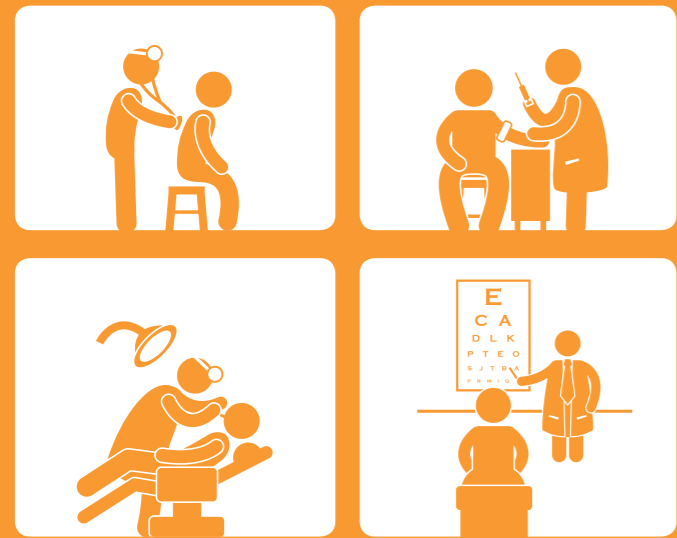
